## Responsibility

- 1. Is a member of the Board
- 2. Is a partner with the Chief Executive in achieving the organization's mission
- 3. Provides leadership to the Board of Directors, who sets policy and to whom the Chief Executive is accountable.
- 4. Chairs meetings of the Board after developing the agenda with the Chief Executive
- 5. Encourages Board's role in strategic planning
- 6. Appoints the chairpersons of committees, in consultation with other Board members
- 7. Serves *ex officio* as a member of committees and attends their meeting at the Chairs discretion
- 8. Discusses issues confronting the organization with the Chief Executive
- 9. Helps to guide and mediate Board actions with respect to organizational priorities and governance concerns.
- 10. Review with the Chief Executive any issues of concern to the Board
- 11. Monitors financial planning and financial reports, as reported to the Board (if separate from Board Chair)
- 12. Formally evaluates the performance of the Chief Executive and informally evaluates the effectiveness of the Board members every 36 months
- 13. Performs other responsibilities assigned by the Board

## **Accountability**

1. The Chairman is accountable to the Board.
